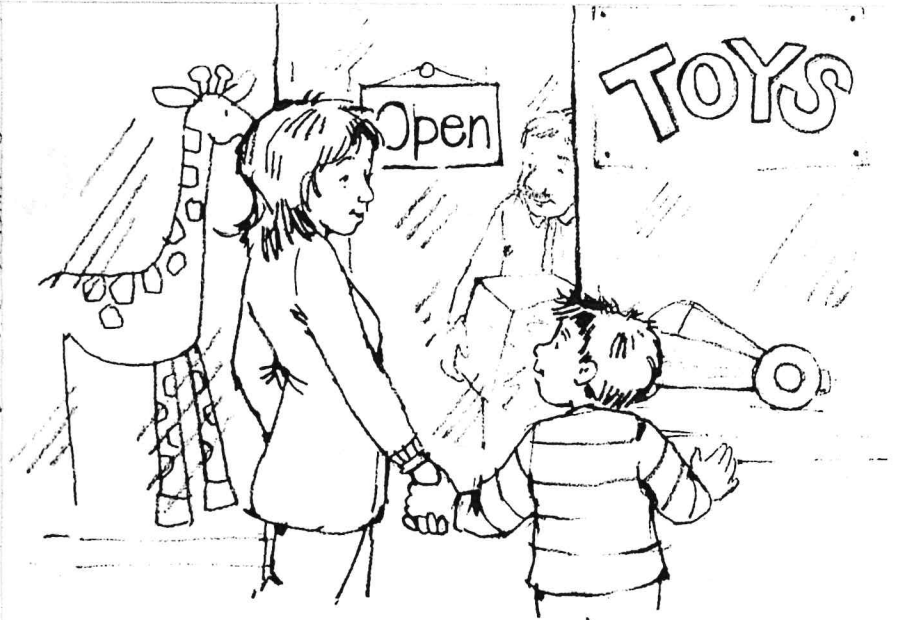

"I like this toy the best," he says. "I can paint this toy!"

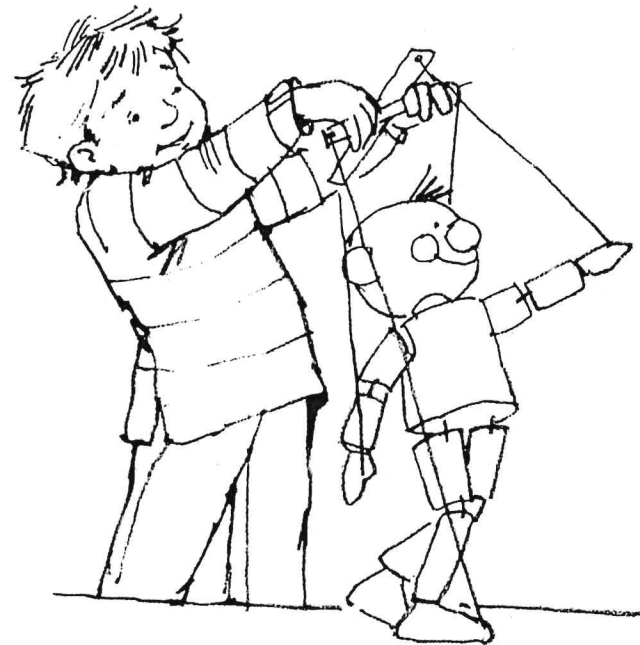


Roy's puppet is made from wood. First Roy paints a face on the toy. "I will use oil paint," says Roy.
