



Teachers should see that the pupil's name is clearly written in ink in the spaces above in every book issued.


The following terms should be used in recording the condition of the book: New; Good; Fair; Poor; Bad.



Monkeys can have short or long fur. Most of them have long tails. Many monkeys use their tails to swing. As they swing, they like to chatter loudly.




We can visit monkeys at the zoo, but not in the wild. Monkeys never live in the wild in North America.




Monkeys are clever animals.
