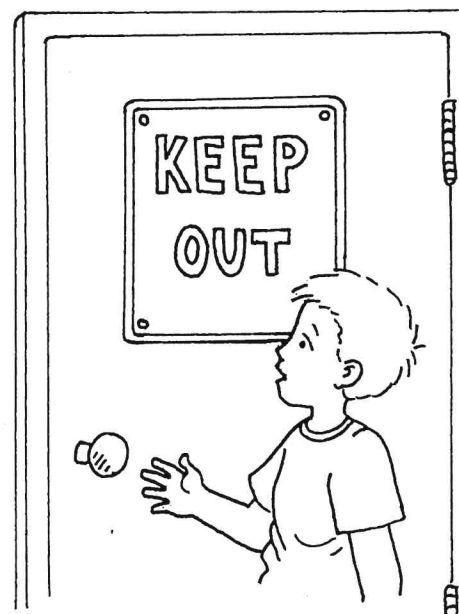
How often do you read signs?

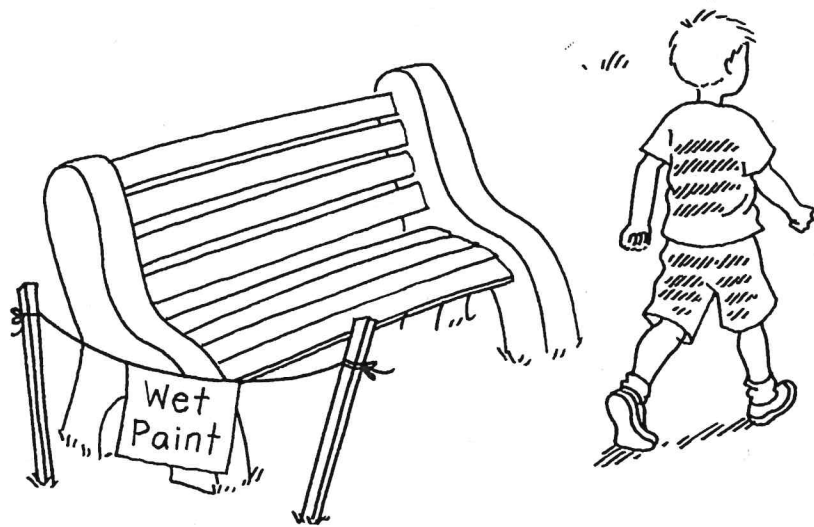

paint is not dry.

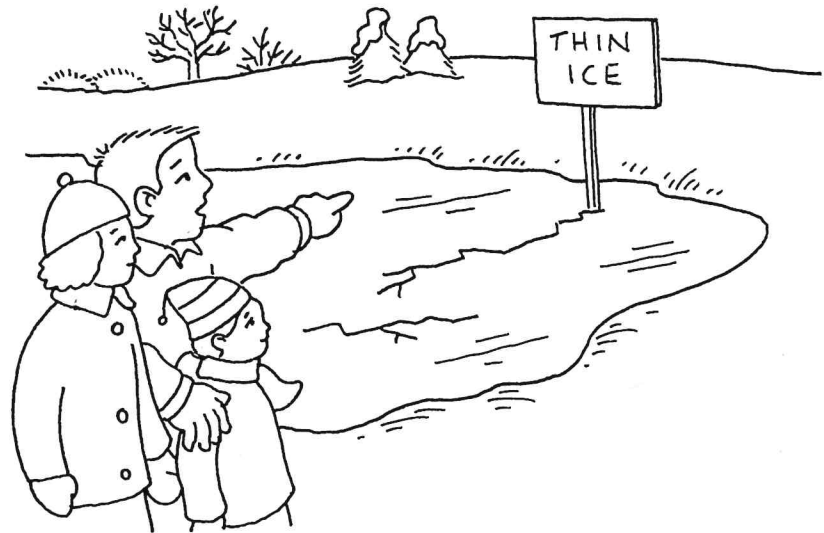
If only the boy had

people write.



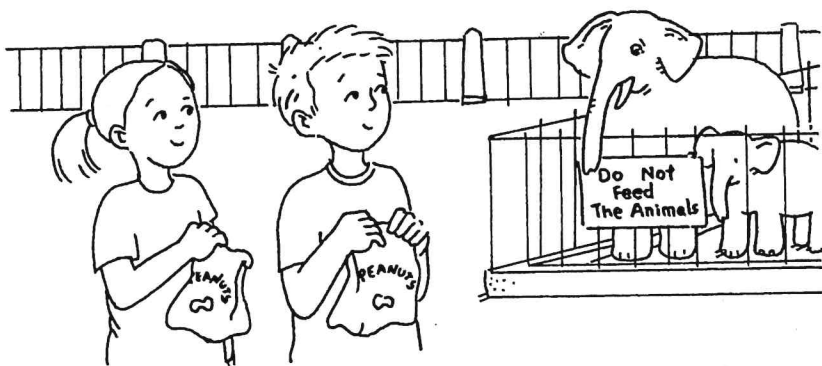
KEEP OFF THE GRASS
