

Madge made fudge for the fair. Would the judge like Madge's fudge? She wanted to win a badge!




Madge made her fudge from scratch. She put a smidge of the batch in her mouth.

"Yuck! This batch is botched!" said Madge. "The fudge is too yucky."




So Madge made fudge once more. She made another batch from scratch.

"I won't botch this batch," she said. "I pledge to make better fudge!"




Madge tested the next batch. She nibbled a little smidge.

"Yum! Very fine!" said Madge. "No fudge can match this batch!"




Madge took her fudge to the fair. There were other fudge cooks there. Every cook looked at the judge.

Every batch of fudge was set on the ledge. The judge would then sample the fudge.


He tested a smidge of each batch. He was a great fudge judge!
