## Lost and Found






I found a little dog. A little dog found me. He came to our house. He was gnarling and snarling outside.

The following terms should be used in recording the condition of the book: New; Good; Fair; Poor; Bad.




He sang out to me from our yard. There was the sound of barking outside. It sounded like a BIG hound dog!
