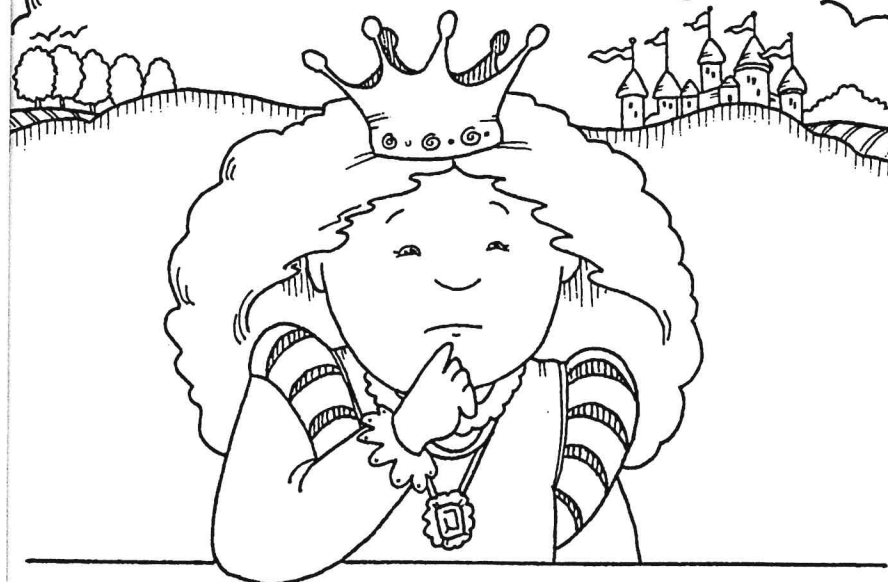

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"I cannot find anything wrong," the efficient physician said. "This patient could be deficient in protein. Have her eat delicious meat pies. That should be sufficient."

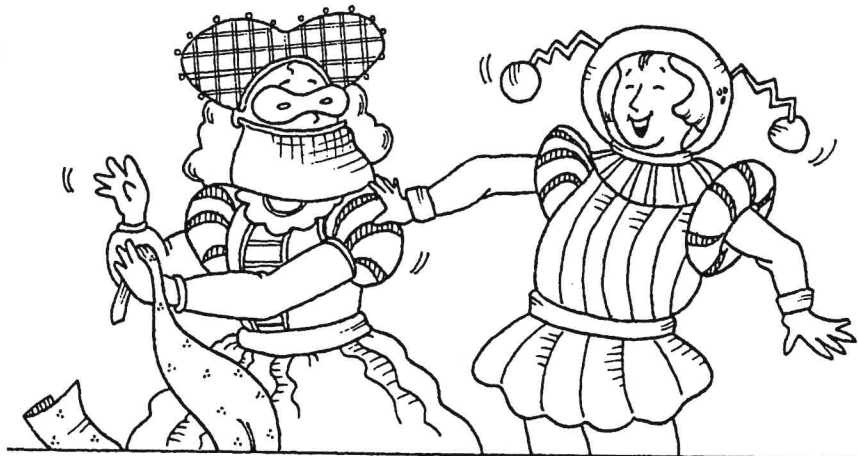
