



## The Scientist and the Poet



Jacob held no such hopes. He did not dislike science. He just liked writing poems more.


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Mr. Brian went on in a monotone. "Draw the name of your science fair partner."

Annie's hands trembled as she read her partner's name. She could not imagine how she would win first prize now!




"Hand me that picture, Jacob," demanded Annie.

"You are a poet!" laughed Annie. "You are as helpful to me as a Martian!"


Jacob did not like being prejudged. "I am a man of action! I am not just old baggage!"
