








Jill wants to ride a cable car. "Hop on, Jill!" says Dad.




"This cable car is full!" Jill says.

Dad says, "It goes to the Nibble Shop. We can get off there." "At times cable cars need a push!" Dad says.


"What makes them work?" asks Jill.
