The Changing Rule

When a word ends in a y, change the y to an i before adding a suffix.



Words that have a y that has changed to an i look like digraph ie. These are not really digraph ie, but they are easy to read because they will also say /ī/ or /ē/! Here are some examples:

1 puppy \rightarrow 4 puppies

I cry. \rightarrow She cries.

1 baby \rightarrow 3 babies

I will try it. \rightarrow My mom tried too. happy \rightarrow happiness

My lawn is grassy \rightarrow His lawn is grassier. \rightarrow Her lawn is the grassiest.

The Changing Rule Exception Do NOT change the y to i with suffix ING!!

Correct:

Mom is frying chicken. ✓ She is studying her math. ✓ What are you copying? <

A long time ago, before we had printers and copy machines, scribes wrote copies of books with pens. It took a long time and their eyes got tired. They wrote in fancy cursive and they had a hard time reading u's when they were next to l's, m's, n's, or v's. They wrote a mark above the u's to help. Later, people thought those u's with a mark on top were o's. Now some words are spelled with o's, but we still say /ŭ/.
